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THE NEW UNDERGRADUATE CURRICULUM

MLCU's new undergraduate curriculum from 2023 is based on the guidelines of the UGC, 2022 and the National Education Policy, 2020. This is an enlightened, career-oriented program which will produce a well-rounded professional with 21 st century skills, ideally equipped to enter the world of work.

3-YEAR DEGREE OR 4-YEAR HONOURS DEGREE

- Emphasis on a 4-year bachelor's degree e.g. BBA Honours through multiple entry-exit options are provided, including a 3-year bachelor's degree e.g. BBA
- · The 4th year honours has two options: internship or research
- · After an honours degree, a master's degree is only one year
- · After an honours degree with research, the student can do PhD directly

MAJOR AND MINOR

- ▷ The Major is the main discipline and degree, eg BBA, BCA, BSW
- The Minor is a skills-based group of subjects that provides a job-oriented set of skills. The student can choose one of the following: Education and Teaching, Media and Communication, Data and Demographics, Nutrition, Sports and Fitness, Management and Office Administration

OTHER SUBJECTS

Every undergraduate student will take the following groups of subjects:

- **Foundation:** Knowing Myself, Career Skills, Human Values, Environment, Music Appreciation, Gender, Reproductive Health and Life Skills Education, Community Engagement and Understanding India, Culture and Art, Health Education, Computer Fundamentals
- Interdisciplinary: the 3 SDG themes are: Quality of life, Equality and Equity (Social, Gender, Economics and Education), and Language, Culture, and Music
- Multidisciplinary: Human Biology & Basic Life Support and Data & Demographics and AI for learning.

THE NEW POSTGRADUATE CURRICULUM

CHOICE OF CAREER ORIENTATION

 All master's students in a particular degree program will have the same subjects from the core discipline and will also have these general subjects: Gender, sexuality and society in Northeast India or Culture and Art and Current Affairs or Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

Each student may choose a career stream from the following:

- o Teaching-learning
- o Research
- o Community engagement
- o Entrepreneurship

The project work (if any) and internship will be aligned to the stream

ONE-YEAR MASTER'S AFTER A 4-YEAR BACHELOR'S DEGREE

A student who has a 4-year honours degree, whether with internship or research may obtain a master's degree in one year, e. g. after a 4-year BSW, MSW will be awarded after one year of study.

ONE-YEAR MASTER'S AFTER A MASTER'S IN A RELATED FIELD

A student who already has a master's degree, may obtain a second master's degree in one year, e. g. after an MCom or MA Economics, and MBA will be awarded after one year of study.

INDIVIDUALISED MASTER'S

- A master's degree, whether in a specialised field or a multidisciplinary study, can be created by the student to suit a professional or career interest.
- > A mentor will be appointed for each individual student
- There will be a considerable component of self-study which will be decided by the student and mentor
- The applied component of study will be decided by the student and mentor

The key features of the program are as follows

- 1. Eligibility:
- · Those who have passed secondary education examination, ie having 10 years of school education
- Those who have passed a secondary education examination and have pursued 1-2 years of higher secondary education but have not passed the higher secondary education examination, ie having 11-12 years of school education. Credits for the passed subjects from any Board will be accepted for transfer of credits
- · Optional: Enrolled for National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) class 12 or planning to enrol
- 2. Duration: Two-years (4 semesters, 80 credits)
- 3. Content: General studies in preparation for NIOS 12
 - Subjects towards a chosen career path* as indicated in the table
- 4. Admission to lateral entry (2nd year) to any UG program in MLCU after the 2-year diploma and passed Class XIIz NIOS. Those who appear but fail in the NIOS, may progress to entry to the second year of UG degree course and will be provided supplementary learning support. They may reappear for NIOS
- 5. Admission to first year of any UG program (with in the career path) after completing the PDDP from MLCU

HYBRID AND BLENDED LEARNING

Teaching-learning has changed immensely because of new concepts in self-learning, facilitation of learning by a teacher mentor, application-based evaluation and the use of technology in teaching and learning. The UGC and NEP 2020 has provided for multiple methods and platforms for learning.

Operational definitions

- 1. Hybrid: combination of online and offline
- 2. Blended: combination of taught and self-learning
- 3. Synchronous online is scheduled real-time learning with a facilitator
- 4. Asynchronous is online self-learning and self-time on assignments, assessment etc.

Under the new guidelines:

- Up to 40% of course work will be online: 8 credits per semester
- At least 60% of course work will be offline: 12 credits per semester

Admission Procedure

The application must be accompanied by a 500-word essay on "Why I want to do a PhD and how will it help my career and benefit society." The applicant will also have to submit a tentative research proposal of approximately 1500 words with five to ten academic references.

Entrance Test: Shortlisted candidates are to appear for an online entrance test.

Interview: Upon clearing the entrance test candidates are required to sit for the online personal interview.

MULTIPLE ENTRY AND EXIT

For Undergraduates:

Students have the option of multiple entry-exit after one, two, three or four years of study.

- UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits/ one month internship during the summer of the first year.
- UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded a UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits / one month internship during the summer of the second year.
- 3-year UG Degree: Students who opt to exit after three years and completed 120 credits will be awarded an undergraduate degree
- 4-year UG Degree: Students who opt to exit after four years and completed 160 credits will be awarded an undergraduate degree Honours/ Honours with research
- Students who exit with a UG certificate or UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within a maximum of seven years
- Students may be permitted to take a break from their study during the period of study but the total duration for completion the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

For Postgraduates:

• For postgraduate programmes, there shall only be one exit point for those who join the two-year Master's programme, that is, at the end of the first year of the Master's programme. Students who exit after the first year shall be awarded the Post-Graduate Diploma.



SUMMER TERM

June 12 to July 7, 2023

Apart from the Autumn and Spring semester, there will be a summer term from **June 12 to July 7**, 2023 for the following subjects.

For the summer term of 2024, a Vocational Course will be included.

- 1. Additional internship /field work: No fee is incurred, but students will need to bear the cost of travel, food and accommodation
- 2. Bridge course: Applicable for new applicants who require to take a bridge course. A fee of Rs 2000 per credit will be incurred by the student
- **3. Supplementary learning/ Back Subject:** June 12-21, 2023. Applicable for current students. Back paper fee as applicable to be incurred by the student



ACADEMIC CALENDAR 2023-2024

Beginning and ending dates for Autumn and Spring Semesters

In making the academic calendar, certain guidelines have been followed. As per UGC regulations, the prescribed minimum number of teaching days is 90 days. In keeping with the requirements of 120/160 credits for undergraduate degrees and 80 credits for postgraduate degrees it has been decided to have 20 teaching weeks per semester so as to align the credits with teaching week. These specifications are followed in the best way possible allowing for public holidays and University events

Accordingly, the following dates for the Autumn and Spring Semesters for the Academic year 2023-2024 are declared. The number of public holidays are already factored in the calendar. However, in the event that the number of public holidays are increased, the same will be compensated for on the preceding Saturday of the declared holiday.

Autumn Semester 2023

For the autumn semester of 2023 (21 weeks/105 days) compensating for nine days of public holidays, five days for University Week and Convocation Day.

For Diploma and Undergraduate programs: Semesters 1, 3 and 5 and for Postgraduate programs Semester 3: **July 18-December 12, 2023**

Spring Semester 2024

HEALTH AND WELL BEING FOR GENERATION Z

Cope with stress and be happy

While university life can be enjoyable and fulfilling as you pursue your preparation for adulthood and the world of work, it can also be a stressful time. Surveys show that most MLCU students are happy with the academics and the extra-curricular student activities.

But this phase of life has stresses as well. Data from surveys conducted on campus in 2020 and 2023 shows similarities to youth all over the world. Among MLCU students:

- · 87% of students have experienced occasional stress, about one-third of students feel stress quite often
- Emotional feelings of 'nervousness', 'anxiety', 'easily irritable', 'loss of interest or pleasure in things', 'sleep problems', 'difficulty in concentration', 'feeling of failure', 'letting the family down', was felt by 43 58% of students.
- Students use many coping strategies: try to work it out myself (63%), help from friends and family (61%), university teachers and counsellor (41%), distract with other things (43%), video games/movies (40%), more sleep (37%), gardening/cooking/baking (34%), arts/crafts (25%), prayer (22%), learning a musical instrument (18%)

About Gen Z

Research data shows that they are:

- More well-behaved, have less risky sex, and consume less alcohol and drugs.
- Socially awakened by Covid, more tuned into social justice
- · Worried about the future, and have a need for self-sufficiency
- · Quieter, with greater awareness of mental health

CENTRE FOR INNOVATION AND INCUBATION

Martin Luther Christian University, Shillong signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the **PRIME Startup Hub, Government of Meghalaya** under the Meghalaya Basin Management Agency (MBMA), on October 28, 2022, to set up the **Entrepreneurship Promotion and Development Programmes (EPDP)** and Incubator at **MLCU, Umsawli Campus.**





The Entrepreneurship Promotion and Development Programmes (EPDP) and Incubator implemented by MLCU through its Centre for innovation and Incubation of Startups and supported by PRIME Startup Hub, will be provided through a series of planned interventions and activities to facilitate support mechanism for aspiring entrepreneurs, start-ups, and early-stage enterprises to translate their innovative ideas into business and sustain them in the long-run by fostering effective networking opportunities. The planned intervention commenced with the establishment of the Centre for Innovation and Incubation of Startups following which the centre is mainly responsible for managing the EPDP activities.

The Centre currently houses a 3D Printing Laboratory to support product and prototype development, a hydroponics laboratory for research in Plant biology and also providing opportunities for entrepreneurship development in vertical farming and allied technology.
