PhD in Religious / Christian Studies / Christian Management: aims at promoting research in Christian ideology and theology in the pluralistic, multi-religious and secular context of Indian reality. A degree in Christian Leadership and Management Studies is designed to help the Church and Christian NGOs with training on fundamental principles of leadership and management, backed by Biblical and
