## 8. Executive summary

The academic year 2024-25 at Martin Luther Christian University (MLCU) has been marked by significant progress across academics, research, community engagement, cultural initiatives, and institutional development.

The University has strengthened its research profile with projects spanning social sciences, health, and cultural studies. Notable initiatives include studies on resilience among tribal Khasi men focusing on marital relations funded by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), the prevalence of sexually transmitted infections also supported by ICMR, parent-child relationships and academic achievement funded internally by MLCU, as well as music and cultural preservation projects such as “Ki Sur Iawbei ka Shnong Krohiawhiar” supported by the North East Zone Cultural Centre (NEZCC). Health-focused research addressing cultural barriers to HIV prevention including local traditions, religious beliefs, and societal taboos highlights MLCU’s commitment to community-relevant research.

MLCU has actively pursued academic collaborations and strategic partnerships. During the year, MoUs were signed with various organizations such as Amit O.P. Sharma & Co., Meghalaya Industrial Development Corporation Ltd., Dr. Jeyasekharan Hospital & Nursing Home, Christian Hospital Bissam Cuttack, Amrita Hospital, Faridabad, Emmanuel Hospital, New Delhi, Universiti Malaya, and the Meghalaya Basin Development Authority (MBDA). These collaborations aim to facilitate internships, skill-building programs and collaborative research initiatives, enhancing practical exposure for students while promoting knowledge exchange.

Community engagement remained central to MLCU. Students and faculty participated various experiential learnings initiatives including community camps, visits to self-help groups and children’s homes, and awareness programs on waste management. Health-focused activities such as blood donation drives conducted in collaboration with the North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health and Medical Sciences (NEIGRIHMS) exemplify the University’s commitment to public health and social responsibility.

The University continued to host seminars, workshops, conferences, and panel discussions to enhance academic learning and professional skills. Key events included the National Conference on Bridging Academic and Industry Innovation, National webinar on personal financial planning and wealth creation through mutual funds, Storytelling in Tourism and Music: Bridging Culture, Emotion and Experience through Theatre Workshop, interactive cultural programs such as the Talawiar: A Narrative Festival, and sessions with the U.S. Air Force band. Faculty and students actively participated, fostering interdisciplinary learning and professional development.

MLCU Press continued to disseminate knowledge through scholarly publications, including the Demystifying Sexuality Handbook, regional folktales, and multi-volume works on the geopolitics of Northeast India and others. These publications reflect MLCU’s focus on cultural

preservation and academic excellence. Complementing this, the University has equipped its research community with state-of-the-art tools, including iThenticate with AI detection, QuillBot Team Plan, NVIVO, and DrillBit-Extreme software, facilitating high-quality research output.

Finally, MLCU continues to nurture innovation and entrepreneurship through its Centre for Innovation and Incubation of Startups. Activities such as Impact Week have fostered creative thinking, entrepreneurial skills among students.

## 9. Landmark achievements

The following are the major achievements of the University during the year:

Sl no	Description
1.	MLCU is also the only University in Northeast India to receive ISO 21001:2018 certification, affirming its commitment to learner-centric education and global best practices. The certificate was awarded by Bureau Veritas following a rigorous audit process, further validating the University's adherence to international quality standards.
2.	MLCU's achievements have been recognized at the national level. The University was ranked 7 <sup>th</sup> in India for Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity Champion and 1 <sup>st</sup> in Meghalaya under Private Multidisciplinary Universities in the Education World India Higher Education Ranking 2025-26.
3.	In the Indian Institutional Ranking Framework (IIRF) 2025, MLCU has been ranked the first in Meghalaya, second in North East and 62 <sup>nd</sup> in India among Private Universities.
4.	At Umsawli, the structural framework for two additional floors is complete, and finishing work continues. These upgrades significantly enhance the campuses for the academic community.
5.	Infrastructure development at the Umphyrnai campus is advancing steadily, with several major milestones achieved and important work ongoing. At Umphyrnai, Phase 1 includes completed retaining walls, ongoing compound fencing, finished site development and earth cutting works for roads and ramps, with super-structure construction underway for the multipurpose hall and Trep 2.

**1.1.5 Thrust areas of Research:**

Presently, the School of Social Work have 3 Research projects. We have 2 research projects funded by Meghalaya AIDS Control Society; one is on the Low turn out of STI Testing under DSRC Meghalaya and the second one is on the Spouse of the Female sex workers with low testing on STI/STD/HIV. Another research is on the marital relationships in terms of abandonment, substance use, and contraceptives used among Khasi Tribal men in Meghalaya funded by ICMR, New Delhi. We also have one Research projects funded by the Voluntary Health Association of Meghalaya on the Social and cultural factors of teenage pregnancy in Dangar, Mawsynram Block, and Jatah Mawkynew Block in East Khasi Hills District, with a focus on assessing the quality of life of teenage mothers. Other thrust areas which the School of Social Work could take up is on health-related issues, livelihood, family, and adolescence-based research, disability and mental health issues.

The School of Allied Health Sciences was set up in 2006 with the mission statement ***“To be a School of excellence, dedicated to quality education in healthcare and research by integrating values, commitment, social consciousness, professionalism and services thereby creating skilled health professionals”*** and with the following objectives:

- To equip students with hands-on experience and enhance their skills in their field of study.
- To prepare them to be skilful and confident as they move from the classroom environment to their work-sphere.
- To uplift healthcare in rural and urban settings.
- To have laboratory, clinical, and community engagement.
- To produce trained professionals who are locally and globally competent and to enhance their employability.

The courses offered are Diploma in Medical Laboratory Technology, Diploma in Medical Imaging Technology, Diploma in Operation Theatre Technology, Diploma in Electrocardiogram Technology, Bachelor of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology, Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging Technology, Bachelor of Science in Surgical, and Operation Theatre Technology, Bachelor of Science in Physician Assistant and Bachelor of Science in Optometry. The post-graduate courses include Master of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology with Specialization in Microbiology, Master of Science in Medical Laboratory with specialization in Clinical Bio-chemistry, Master of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology Generic, Master of Science in Medical Imaging Technology.

The Department follows the model curriculum of the Ministry of Health. The clinical postings are in-house and to hospitals for hands-on exposure alongside health camps in urban and rural areas. The Under Graduate (UG) students go for a 12 months' internship and carry out a project during the period whereas Post Graduate (PG) and diploma students go for a six months' duration of internship with a dissertation (PG).

- **Cultural Exposure:** Engagement with diverse ethnic groups to enhance intercultural competence, empathy, and contextual understanding.

#### Weaknesses

- **Limited Student Enrolment:** The current low number of student enrolments for the year 2024-2025 affects classroom interaction, peer learning, and exposure to diverse perspectives. This limitation reduces opportunities for group-based ministry activities and collaborative projects.
- **Reduced Peer Engagement:** With fewer students, the exchange of ideas and mutual learning experiences is somewhat limited, which can impact overall student motivation and leadership development.

## **Opportunities**

- **Grassroots and Cultural Engagement:** Theology students are given opportunities to engage directly with grassroots realities and culturally rooted issues within their communities. This exposure helps them understand the complex interplay between faith, tradition, and contemporary challenges faced by individuals and groups. By exploring social, spiritual, and cultural dimensions at the community level, students learn to discern pathways for transformation that honor both biblical principles and the age-old customs of the people they serve. Through field experiences, reflective learning, and guided mentorship, they develop the capacity to contextualize Christian education and counselling approaches in culturally sensitive ways. This process empowers future ministers, educators, and counsellors to integrate theological insights with local wisdom building bridges between Christian faith and indigenous traditions while promoting holistic healing, reconciliation, and spiritual growth.

## **Challenges**

- **Adapting to Multidisciplinary and Experiential Learning:** Some students face difficulty adjusting to the new approach of education that emphasizes internships, practical exposure, and collaboration across multiple disciplines.
- **Traditional Mind-set:** Certain students prefer to focus solely on their area of specialization, making it challenging to fully engage with interdisciplinary learning and integrated ministry practices.

The Centre for Career Development and Placement was created to offer career guidance services for students with the following objectives:

- To facilitate students to identify the sources of educational and occupational information that enables career decision process.
- To address the individual development/ career development and transitions throughout the lifespan.
- To give proper orientation to students on employability skills which will create more avenues for young people to acquire meaningful employment, including self-employment.
- To follow up on the professional development of the students by training them towards employability skills such as resume building, group discussion and interview skills which in turn can help the students to move into a desired occupation and/or apply in prestigious professional schools for higher studies/ employment.

### 3.2.3 Faculty:

In 2018, the Board of Governors approved the creation of the Centre as an administrative centre under the Office of the Dean of Students. It does not have or require full-time faculty. The centre conducts various career guidance programs and awareness initiatives for the students of the University, as well as community outreach programs in schools and communities in Meghalaya and Northeast India.

Additionally, the centre conducts a Foundation Course in Career Skills, usually held once a year for the 1st-semester undergraduate students. This program is facilitated by the faculty members of the Career Team, who support the activities of the Centre from time to time. Currently, the Centre is reorganised and is under the Faculty of Management (Circular No.: 74 III/8(8)/Admin/265/2015 dated August 19, 2024). At present, there are 6 faculty members who are Jiva License Career Counsellors.

## **Diversity**

According to the MLCU Act 2005, Section 9, “The University shall be open to all persons irrespective of class, caste, creed, religion, language or gender, provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed to require the University from making special provisions for admission to students of the State.” In accordance with the Act, the University shall admit:

- Students from a wide diversity of backgrounds irrespective of class, caste, creed, religion, language, or gender
- Students from a variety of academic backgrounds who have studied in government, private, church, and other religious schools and from varying levels of academic performance
- At no time shall admissions be made purely on academic merit but shall take into consideration also issues of diversity and social and academic status
- Students from the State of Meghalaya and the Northeast region shall ordinarily be given preference. All admissions are based primarily on the following criteria:
  1. Fulfilling the minimum eligibility required to pursue undergraduate and postgraduate studies
  2. No minimum percentage is set up as a criterion for admission to the programmes at both UG and PG levels

## **Late and any time admissions**

Understanding that the students often have valid reasons for late applications, the University has made the following provisions:

- Regular admissions shall be continued till 30 days after the first day of classes
- After the close of regular admissions and up to thirty days later, students may be admitted with the following provisions:
  1. Missed classes will need to be covered
  2. Mentoring will be provided by faculty member(s) to catch up with their academic work
  3. Academic counselling will be provided
  4. Payment of fees for extra classes
  5. A log of the catch-up learning will be maintained and signed by the student and Head of Department and forwarded to the Dean,

Academics for academic and administrative processing

6. Students will be permitted to proceed to the subsequent semester according to the Promotion Policy of the University
- Applicants in difficult situations

### **Applicants in difficult situations**

Occasionally, the University receives incomplete applications or applications from students in difficult situations. These may pertain to incomplete eligibility qualifications, transitions of residence (such as displaced persons or refugees), pending final examinations or delayed issuance of certificates and transcripts, or other unforeseen circumstances. The University endeavours to help such applicants in the best way possible. Such applicants may be granted admission on a provisional basis and the student may commence the programme. Such provisional admission will be regularized when the difficult situation is resolved.

### **Foreign students**

1. Applicants should apply for a Student Visa after receiving the admission letter
2. Processing fees of Rs. 10,000
3. Registration with the Foreign Registration Office (FRO) of Meghalaya after arrival in Shillong

Liberal arts education has evolved over time, beginning with tribal societies in India, China, and the Arab world. Modern higher education institutions like Ivy League universities in the US revived liberal arts as the touchstone of undergraduate education in the early 20th century. However, most Indian universities still cling to colonial prescriptions, producing well-rounded graduates rather than citizens.</p> <p>To align with the statutory environment, biological, social, and psychological evidence, aspirations of youth, and the needs of the marketplace and society, the curriculum must change radically. This includes shifting emphasis from single discipline to multidisciplinary, prioritizing visual-spatial, analytical-logical, naturalistic, musical, kinesthetics, intra- and interpersonal learning, making learning more interesting through real-life materials, promoting convergence and unification of knowledge from arts, humanities, and science, and incorporating feedback from students about their interests, career goals, and personal values.</p> <p>Further, according to the NEP 2020, the four year Under Graduate Programme (FYUP) aims to provide students with the opportunity to engage in a comprehensive and multidisciplinary education, alongside a concentration on their selected major and minors. Initially, UGC allowed up to 40% of a course to be offered online, but this was later increased to <b>50% of the total programme</b> under the <i>UGC (Open and Distance Learning and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020</i> and subsequent amendments. This shift aims to combine the benefits of classroom interaction with the scalability and personalization of digital education, empowering students with 21st-century skills and encouraging innovative teaching practices (UGC, 2022). Courses can be delivered via SWAYAM or other approved platforms like COURSERA, ensuring quality and standardization across institutions. In the <b>University for the UG programme</b>, students may take up to <b>20% of 22 credits (4–5 credits)</b> online in the 1st year, <b>40% of 22 credits (8–9 credits)</b> in the 2nd year, and <b>50% of 20 credits (10 credits)</b> in the 3rd year. For the <b>PG programme</b>, students may take <b>50% of 21 credits (11 credits)</b> online in the 1st year and <b>50% of 20 credits (10 credits)</b> in the 2nd year.</p>

March 31, 2025

**A. Significant Accounting Policies:**

**1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements**

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and all significant items of income and expenditure are accounted on the accrual basis of accounting. The Statements of Accounts comply with generally accepted accounting policies and mandatory accounting standards and statements issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

**2. Use of estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the University to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent liabilities at the dates of the financial statements, and the results of operations during the reported period. Although these estimates are based on the University's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and the estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known or materialized.

**3. Income Recognition**

All income including tuition and other fees are recognized on their due dates on accrual basis. The portion of fees received which pertains to the subsequent financial year are treated as fees received in advance.

**4. Expenses**

All expenses are accounted on accrual basis and provisions are made for all known liabilities.

**5. Fixed Assets**

Fixed assets are stated at their cost of acquisition inclusive of freight, duties, taxes and incidental expenses relating to acquisition of the asset, and the cost of installation/erection as applicable.

**6. Depreciation**

Depreciation is charged on cost as per written down value method as per rates given in Rule 5, Appendix I of the Income-tax Rules, 1962 but the same is charged on pro-rata basis based on days of uses. Leasehold improvements are amortized over the period of the lease and computer software has been depreciated @ 40%.

## **7. Impairment of Assets**

Impairment of an asset would take place when the carrying value of the asset exceeds its recoverable amount. Accordingly, impairment losses will be charged to the Income & Expenditure Account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognized in a previous accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of the recoverable amount.

## **8. Provisions**

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Provisions that are not otherwise made in the accounts are disclosed by way of appropriate note, wherever applicable.

## **9. Contingent Liabilities & Contingent Assets**

Contingent liabilities are not recognized, but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

## **B. Notes on Accounts:**

1. Fixed assets include building in progress and expenses incurred towards land development.
2. Depreciation has been charged on the written down value of assets as per rates given in Rule 5, Appendix I of the Income-tax Rules, 1962 and computation of depreciation on additions during the year has been made from the date on which the assets have been effectively put to use. Leasehold improvements have been amortized over the period of lease.
3. Interest earned on investment of university endowment fund has been allocated between the Development Fund and Endowment Fund in accordance with Section 40(4) of the Martin Luther Christian University Act, 2005. Interest earned on investment of other endowment funds is apportioned among the respective funds.
4. The University undertakes execution of projects and carries out consulting engagements on behalf of government agencies and non-governmental organizations as part of its initiatives to build practical knowledge for its faculty and students. The receipts and disbursements in respect of projects and consulting engagements completed during the year are stated in the Income & Expenditure Statement and the remaining ones are carried over under Designated Fund Accounts in the Balance Sheet.

6. As per the current year there is no provision made for doubtful debts as there is enough provision made in the previous year.
7. There are outstanding amounts as raised by the Income Tax Department for the AY 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2018-19 for which an appeal/rectification has been filed with the Income Tax Department and have been contested against the same.
8. Previous year figures have been regrouped and re-arranged wherever necessary.
